

## **Jesus, Our Creator God**

### **John 1:1-10**

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. 4 In Him was life, and the life was the light of men.

5 And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. 6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 This man came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all through him might believe. 8 He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light. 9 That was the true Light which gives light to every man coming into the world. 10 He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

Down through the ages there has been a constant attack on the person of Jesus.

Even some of our most notable theologians today refuse to accept what the Bible says about Jesus.

Behind every disobedience on the part of the Christian there is a refusal to accept who Jesus is, God our Creator.

Notice in the next few verses John talks about the constant struggle between light and darkness.

Joh 1:10 He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

Notice how in verse 11 he says that He came to His own and they would not receive Him.

If the religious people of our world can play down Jesus they are free to choose their own course.

- I. The Word is connected to creation because the Bible teaches that the creation was spoken into existence.
  - A. Ps 33:6 By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, And all the host of them by the breath of His mouth.
  - B. Heb. 11:3 By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.
  - C. But John does not use the word created here, but the word become.
    1. He is literally saying that everything outside of God came to be, or came into existence by the Word of God.
  - D. This does not mean that God the Father and God the Holy Spirit had no part in creation, it was a joint effort.
    1. Ge 1:26 ¶ Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping

thing that creeps on the earth."

2. Throughout this first chapter of Genesis God is spoken of as more than one.
3. In Hebrew there are three designations.
  - a. Singular
  - b. Two
  - c. Or three or more. This is the designation used in Genesis one.

II. The Bible does not make Jesus out to be a god among gods but the creator God, one with the Father.

- A. Eph 3:9 and to make all see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the ages has been hidden in God who created all things through Jesus Christ;
- B. Col 1:16 For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. 17 And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist.
- C. Heb 1:2 has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; 3 who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

III. The world will accept Jesus as a great teacher but not as the Son of the Father, and the Creator with whom we must deal.

- A. Joh 5:18 Therefore the Jews sought all the more to kill Him, because He not only broke the Sabbath, but also said that God was His Father, making Himself equal with God. 19 Then Jesus answered and said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner.

I want to close with some passage that display the significance of Jesus as the Creator.

Isa 45:12 I have made the earth, And created man on it. I—My hands—stretched out the heavens, And all their host I have commanded.

Isa 45:18 For thus says the LORD, Who created the heavens, Who is God, Who formed the earth and made it, Who has established it, Who did not create it in vain, Who formed it to be inhabited: "I am the LORD, and there is no other.

Heb 1:10 And: "You, LORD, in the beginning laid the foundation of the earth, And the heavens are the work of Your hands. 11 They will perish, but You remain; And they will all grow old like

a garment; 12 Like a cloak You will fold them up, And they will be changed. But You are the same, And Your years will not fail."

Heb 3:3 For this One has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as He who built the house has more honor than the house. 4 For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God.

Re 4:11 "You are worthy, O Lord, To receive glory and honor and power; For You created all things, And by Your will they exist and were created."
