

A Full Atonement

1 John 4:9-10

9 In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. 10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

This all begins with the covering provided Adam and Eve.

It is seen again in the offering of Cain not accepted.

The sacrificial system was to provide an atonement. Lev 1:4

Le 1:4 'Then he shall put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him.

It culminates in the Day of Atonement, Yon Kipur.

But none of these could take away sin.

Heb 10: 1 ¶ For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect. 2 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. 3 But in those sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. 4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins. 5 Therefore, when He came into the world, He said: "Sacrifice and offering You did not desire, But a body You have prepared for Me. 6 In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin You had no pleasure.

Ro 8:3 For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh,

On the day of atonement God would accept the sacrifice of the sprinkling of blood by it vaporizing from the mercy seat.

We know that the sacrifice of Jesus was accepted in that He raised Him from the dead.
